- February call volume was steady at 31 calls.
 - 31 total calls were received.
 - 16 calls were forwarded. 4 calls forwarded (and connected) were first-time calls. Thank you to all that responded.
 - o 15 calls were not forwarded. There was fewer Al-Anon call. All Al-Anons were requested to have the alcoholic contact the answering service. There were a few hang-ups and refusals to accept a return call. Two calls were wrong numbers. No first-time call went unanswered.

- The Al-Anon phone number has been added to our call list. (888) 425-2666. I have also instructed the answering service to instruct their call receivers to be aware of Al-Anon type callers and that in addition to suggesting that the alcoholic call us, that they also give out the Al-Anon phone number.
