5 Parts of Step 10 \

This thought brings us to Step Ten, which suggests we **continue** to take personal inventory and **continue** to set right any new mistakes as we go along. We vigorously commenced this way of living as we cleaned up the past. We have entered the world of the Spirit. Our next function is to grow in understanding and effectiveness. This is not an overnight matter. It should **continue** for our lifetime. 

Continue to watch for selfishness, dishonesty, resentment, and. 

When these crop up, we ask God at once to remove them. 

We discuss them with someone immediately and 

make amends quickly if we have harmed anyone. 

Then we resolutely turn our thoughts to someone we can help. Love and tolerance of others is our code.

And we have ceased fighting anything or anyone - even alcohol. For by this time sanity will have returned. We will seldom be interested in liquor. If tempted, we recoil from it as from a hot flame. We react sanely and normally, and we will find that this has happened automatically. We will see that our new attitude toward liquor has been given us without any thought or effort on our part. It just comes! That is the miracle of it. We are not fighting it, neither are we avoiding temptation. We feel as though we had been placed in a position of neutrality - safe and protected. We have not even sworn off. Instead, the problem has been removed. It does not exist for us. We are neither cocky nor are we afraid. That is our experience.

10 That is how we react so long as we keep in fit spiritual condition.

It is easy to let up on the spiritual program of action and <u>rest on our laurels.</u> We are headed for trouble if we do, for alcohol is a subtle foe. <u>We are not cured of alcoholism.</u> What we really have is a <u>daily reprieve contingent on the maintenance of our spiritual condition.</u> Every day is a day when we must carry the vision of God's will into all of our activities. "How can I best serve Thee - Thy will (not mine) be done."

These are thoughts which must go with us constantly. We can exercise our will power along this line all we wish. It is the proper use of the will.

Much has already been said about receiving strength, inspiration, and direction from Him who has all knowledge and power. If we have carefully followed directions, we have begun to sense the flow of His Spirit into us. To some extent we have become God-conscious. We have begun to develop this vital sixth sense. But we must go further and that means more action.

# Voices of District 11 Shares on Step 10

## Some gathered notes about Step 10, from pages 84 & 85 of the Big Book, Alcoholics Anonymous.

Atheist and Agnostics <u>may</u> substitute Love or GoOD for "god" "He can choose any concept he likes, provided it makes sense to him." (Pg. 93)

Page Number: <u>Complete</u> Sentence Number - <u>Not</u> the Line Number

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When we focus on what we can give rather than what we can take, we lose our fear that we will not get what we want. We are no longer afraid that our own resources are all that we have to draw upon. We find that conscious contact with God is all we really need to be happy in life.

**84:7** We practice the application of spiritual principles as a way of addressing our problems and find the guidance of God is available to us when we seek it.

**84:8** The truth is that if we could have stopped drinking, addressed our defects of character, and righted our past wrongs on our own power we would have done so long ago.

By seeking in earnest, we have accessed a Power greater than ourselves. All we need to do for proof is to examine the results.

**84:12** The key is that we must work to build sufficient spiritual experience so that we may draw upon it when we are challenged or tempted. These profound changes in our lives come about as the result of the repeated application of spiritual principles in all areas of our lives. It works for everyone who honestly tries.

**84:13** To continue, we must first begin. We learn how to take inventory in Steps Four and Five. We learn how to address our character defects in Steps Six and Seven.

We learn how to make amends for the harm we cause in Steps Eight and Nine. We practice these techniques until we master them. Then we are at Step 10.

## DCM REPORT September 2nd, 2010

Hello All!

I attended the Area Committee Meeting on August 7<sup>th</sup>, 2010. At this meeting I reported on all the great work that our committees are doing here in District 11. I was informed that ATP(Addiction Treatment Program) in Waukegan is looking for participation from other districts due to the fact that many patients there are from and return to districts in surrounding areas(I was one of them).

There is a sponsorship/bridge the gap panel at ATP on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday of the month at 12:45pm. If you would like more info on how you can help their clients that are returning to District 11/McHenry County area contact the District 12 CPC Chair Frank at 224-399-6720. Sheridan Correctional Facility is still in need of male volunteers to take meetings to the prison. I have an application if anyone is interested. Area 20 will be accepting bids to host the 2011 Big Book Conference at the Fall Assembly September 18<sup>th</sup> in Naperville.

Our current Delegate, Ray M., reported some interesting information at the meeting:

- There were 53,000 attendees in San Antonio at the International Convention of AA July 4<sup>th</sup> weekend
- Literature sales at GSO are about 13% less than budgeted for the first 6 months of the year and the gross literature profits are down about 39% compared to last year at the same time due to the "stockpiling" of literature prior to the Big Books price increase
- There was a gross profit at GSO for the first 6 months of 2010 of \$679,000 which is remarkable given lagging literature sales. This is due to across the board cost saving by our GSO General Manager Phyllis Halliday and the entire GSO staff
- I was asked to communicate to the Fellowship the spiritual value of our contributions: support GSO services to your home group and to carry the message throughout the US and around the world("a buck in the basket isn't what it used to be", make contributions online at aa.org, buy conference approved literature from GSO)
- For the 6 months ended June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2010 the Grapevine lost \$286,223. To support the effort of the Grapevine Board the Conference Grapevine Committee is attempting to gather information from the fellowship on the value of the Grapevine to them. This survey can be found at area 20s website (www.aa-nia.org) Please ask your group to review and complete the survey. The Grapevine is not planning on discontinuing printed issues only looking for ways to improve
- There is also an E-Tech survey from GSO in the same place which is trying to determine what the fellowship would like made available electronically

I Attended the Illinois State Conference Hosted by District 11 in Lisle and had a wonderful time. I attended an AA history workshop and a concepts workshop which were both entertaining and informative.

On Sunday our East Central Regional Trustee spoke about what's happening at GSO which I appreciated. After she talked Gayle S. from GSO told her story of recovery from alcoholism and also shared her experience working at GSO which I thought was fantastic (I actually got to speak to Gayle more at GSO in NYC the following weekend).

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The following weekend August 26-29<sup>th</sup> I attended the 52<sup>nd</sup> ICYPAA(International Convention of Young People in Alcoholics Anonymous) in Times Square, New York City. There were 4,789 registered guests of this conference. This conference was also a blast. I am part of a committee that was bidding to host the conference in Chicago. The Chicago Bid for ICYPAA was not awarded the conference so we will be bidding again at the 53<sup>rd</sup> ICYPAA in San Francisco 2011!

While I was in New York I visited GSO and this was definitely a highlight of my trip. We attended the Friday 11am meeting at GSO then were given a tour of the offices where we were able to meet various staff members, browse the GSO archives, and meet the Grapevine staff. Anyone traveling to New York I would highly recommend this.

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**84: 15** We enter the world of the spirit when we have cleared away all the obstacles that stand in our way. To maintain our conscious contact with our Higher Power we must continue to practice the principles of the program. Should we revert back to self- sufficiency we become separated from God.

**84: 16** We grow by study and practice. Bill W. adopted spiritual ideas and practices that brought about a spiritual awakening while in Town's Hospital. He reflected upon his experience so that he could transmit this experience to others. The result was the Twelve Steps of A.A. By studying this program of action and practicing the principles described in this book, we become more effective at carrying this solution to others.

**84:18** The steps of this program are not magic tricks to be performed once so that they might solve all our problems. Rather, the steps are a discipline, a body of theory and technique that must be studied and practiced if we are to be able to apply this program to our lives. We continue with the techniques we have begun to practice in the earlier steps.

We continue to write our inventory. We continue to admit our shortcomings. We continue to ask God for relief from our shortcomings and we continue to make amends when we are wrong.

**84:22-23** Being freed from the chains of selfishness we are able to follow a path that leads to happiness, joy and fulfillment. Our very lives depend upon this change of motivation (20:1). While we are in the grip of selfishness we are dead to the Spirit. Our work helping others brings our faith to life so that we may truly live.

**84:25** As a result of these steps, the ability to differentiate the true from the false returns. We have become convinced of the truth of the ABC's (60: 11-13).

The truth is that we have built our lives on a false foundation of selfishness and self-centeredness and it has caused our lives to come tumbling down around our ears. We re-found our lives based on faith in God and helpfulness to others. This new way of life brings us happiness and a sense of purpose.

**85:1-11** Our spiritual malady must be over-come before we straighten out mentally and physically (64: 18).

The obsession to drink leaves many of us as 'We admit to ourselves, to God and to another person, the exact nature of our wrongs (75:14). Though all our human resources have failed to overcome our alcoholism, we find that God can and will.

**85: 12** Stopping drinking and finding God does not make us spiritual giants. Many of us come crawling in with our lives shattered, willing to do anything for a hope of escape from alcoholic torture. Soon the pain and suffering is forgotten and our egos begin to resurface.

We begin to feel a conscious separation from God. The insanity returns. We feel that we are capable of managing our own lives and God is relegated to the role of bush league pinch hitter. Yesterday's conscious contact will not keep us sober today. We must continue the practices we have learned in the steps.

**85:15** Our spiritual condition is one of humility developed through our admission of powerlessness and confession of our character defects. God's help is available to us only when we are humble enough to acknowledge our need for it. Should the illusion of self-sufficiency return in sufficient strength to block us from God, our own human resources will be all we have at our disposal when confronted with temptation or uncertainty. Continuing the practices that help to humble keeps us in fit spiritual condition.

**85:16-20** The realignment of our motivations, thinking and actions brings about miraculous changes in our lives. Casting aside our selfishness, we fill our thoughts and lives with the search for ways to be useful to God and our fellows. We thus gain access to the infinite

power of God. The authors suggest several techniques throughout this book that we may use to direct our thinking towards God's will.

**85:22** Taking what we want from this program of action and leaving the rest will not bring about the spiritual awakening that we must experience if we are to overcome alcoholism. Picking and choosing those parts that are most appealing to us will not allow us to undergo the entire psychic change that results in our restoration to sanity. The authors give clear-cut directions (29: 1) for us to follow if we desire to have victory over alcohol (76: 19) and find a spiritual experience (79:5).

**85:22** By admitting to ourselves our need for God, confessing our shortcomings, and attempting to clean up the wreckage of our past, we open ourselves to the entry of God. The abandonment of our old ways of thinking and acting creates a cavity in us that the Spirit quickly fills.

**85:23** We become God-conscious by the direct personal experience we develop through working the steps. We adopt new ways of viewing the world and our part in it. We practice accessing the power of God to solve our problems. In these practical ways we come to believe in the ability of this Power to restore us to sanity. We come to know from our experience that we can rely upon the help of our Higher Power
